A person who willfully interrupts, disturbs, or disrupts an official meeting and who, upon being directed to leave the meeting by the presiding officer, willfully refuses to leave the meeting is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

(1919, c. 655, s 1; 1993, c. 539, s. 1028; 1994, Ex. Sess., c. s. 14 (c).)

PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

The public comment period will allow citizens of Trinity to address all members of Council at the beginning of the Council meeting. Residents desiring to address the Council shall print their name, address and signature on the Speakers Sign-Up sheet provided on the table prior to the mayor calling the meeting to order.

Citizens may address the members of Council on any subject that is within the jurisdiction of the local government, or during an agenda item while it is before Council. Citizens will choose which time they desire to address Council. When the mayor calls your name, please go to the podium. Please state your name and address for the record. Speakers are limited to a period of 3 minutes. If citizens request more time, it will be at the discretion of the Trinity City Council. Speakers shall be courteous in their language and presentation. Citizens have a right to assert a public complaint or criticism. However, personal attacks on including but not limited to public officials, public employees and/or any other entity or party, are not permitted. Speakers should not discuss issues that concern the candidacy of any person seeking public office or matters in current or anticipated litigation. Common interest groups are encouraged to select a spokesperson if several people plan to make similar points.

Please direct comments to all members of Council and not to individual members. Response, discussion or actions concerning issues raised during the public comments may be addressed by our Manager, members of Council or Mayor at their discretion during their scheduled comment time in accordance with the approved agenda.

Articles Allowed:

RECYCABLES: Paper, cans, plastic, glass, electronics, metal (*recyclables must be pre-separated from trash*)

YARD WASTE: Limbs no longer than 4 feet and no larger than 4 inches in diameter. Wood chipper on site—free mulch may be available. First come-first served. Load your own truck.

TRASH: Household waste, junk.

Batteries: Vehicle Batteries are allowed.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING: Old computer equipment, cell phones, TVs, anything with a cord.

What's not allowed: Tires, appliances, wet paint (dried paint is OK), toxic or hazardous materials, commercial waste. (Some items may be taken to the County Landfill) Fluorescent tubes and bulbs and household batteries
